





Traffic patterns continue to change around the future Arbutus Station – Night work starts Dec. 9 and portion of Maple Street will be restricted on Dec. 18

Note: The notice from Oct. 25, 2021 included this work and we now have current scheduling details to share.

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood continuing to prepare for the installation of the traffic deck between Arbutus and Cypress streets. Upcoming work includes new vehicle restrictions, adjusting traffic signals, and drilling for the traffic deck vertical supports.

What to Expect

Throughout major construction activities, access to residences, businesses, and parking lots will be maintained. To prepare for the start of drilling activities, electrical signals and lights will be adjusted on W. Broadway at Burrard, Cypress, Maple, and Arbutus streets. Line painting from Pine to Burrard streets will be required to support electrical work, as well as lane shifts from Fir to Burrard streets. This work will be done overnight from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. beginning Dec. 9; elevated noise during this work is expected. Then, on Dec. 18, vehicle access to the north side of Maple St. will be restricted until the end of the project in 2025. Vehicle access to the parkade and both pedestrian and cyclist access across Maple Street will be maintained. Residents and businesses in the area will experience elevated noise during the traffic shift from 8 p.m. on Dec. 18 to 7 a.m. on Dec. 19 from Maple to Yew streets. Finally, drilling for the traffic deck on the southside of W. Broadway will continue between Maple and Arbutus streets starting on Dec. 20.

We thank residents for their patience while we conduct the necessary night work. People travelling in the area may experience some traffic congestion. Truck turning movements at the intersection of Arbutus and Broadway may be restricted as traffic is shifted. Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.
