





Water line relocation along Earl Finning Way near the future Great Northern Way – Emily Carr Station

December 15, 2021

UPDATE: The notification dated <u>November 29, 2021</u>, has been updated with current scheduling details, traffic, and impacts/interruptions.

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) will be in your neighbourhood preparing for the construction of the elevated guideway. As of December 14, BSPC is installing fencing along the north side of Earl Finning Way and commencing water line relocation work.

Traffic access to Earl Finning Way will remain open but will be reduced to one lane in an eastbound direction. There will be no parking permitted during the water line relocation. People in the area should expect possible temporary road closures and reduced street parking, speed limits, and reduced lanes. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Please note, this information is current at the time of sending, however due to unforeseen circumstances, schedules are subject to change. BSPC will update this notification as additional dates and times for the water line relocation are confirmed. BSPC will directly contact any businesses or residences who may be affected by a water shutdown if required.

What to Expect



Timing

- Began December 14, 2021
- Estimated duration: 3 weeks



Hours of Work

- Monday to Friday, 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Night work on Fraser Street may be required, 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.



Traffic

- Access to Earl Finning Way will be reduced to a single lane, eastbound only.
- Occasional night work may require Fraser Street to be closed (in yellow on map).
- Occasional single lane of alternating traffic on Earl Finning Way may be required during the night work.
- There will be no street parking on either side of Earl Finning Way for the duration the Broadway Subway Project.



Impacts/Interruptions

- People travelling or living in the area may notice an increase in construction vehicles.
- Elevated noise from the excavation process is expected during utility works.

Other important information:

- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
- Emergency access is maintained at all times.
- When possible, crews will perform the noisiest construction activities during the day to reduce overnight noise.

We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood and on your property. We will continue to keep you informed in advance of any local work now and in the future to help you plan accordingly. Thank you in advance for your patience.

Updates will also be emailed to local registered contacts, and additional notification will be provided where possible. Please note, construction schedules can change on short notice.
