





Utilities are being relocated between Laurel and Oak streets on West Broadway – Lane closure and night work begins January 17

January 11, 2022

Note: The notice from December 10, 2021 included this work and we now have current scheduling details to share.

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood relocating utility lines on W. Broadway between Laurel and Oak streets. Completing this utility relocation requires temporary traffic changes and night work until January 24. BSPC will directly contact businesses and residents we anticipate will be affected if a water shutdown is required.

What to Expect

Access to residences, businesses, and parking lots will be maintained during temporary traffic restrictions at night. The westbound right turn-lane from W. Broadway to Oak Street will be closed and then re-opened during the day. This work will result in elevated noise at night. Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, conducting the noisiest construction activities during the day, minimizing the need to use back-up beepers on site, and installing white noise back-up beepers on heavy construction equipment for night construction.

We thank residents for their patience while we conduct the necessary night work. Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. The map below shows the area of work. Please note, this information is current at the time of sending; however, schedules are subject to change. BSPC will update the website with specific dates once timelines are confirmed.
