





Traffic and pedestrian patterns are changing around the future Oak-VGH Station on April 23 – Night Work

April 20, 2022

Note: The notice from Feb. 23, 2022 includes this work and we have updated scheduling, traffic details, and impacts to share.

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood and on April 23, traffic will shift onto the newly constructed traffic deck on the north side of W. Broadway between Laurel and Oak streets. BSPC will then begin building the traffic deck on the south side of W. Broadway. Part of this work includes re-routing pedestrian access in front of the future Oak-VGH Station entrance on the south side of W. Broadway at Laurel St. In addition, the western crosswalk across W. Broadway, and the southern crosswalk across Laurel St. will be closed for the duration of the project to facilitate station construction. The traffic deck is expected to be completed this summer. Sidewalk access to the south side of Broadway between Oak St. and Laurel St. is maintained. Please watch for pedestrian detour signs to assist with navigating the area. In the map below, the red shows restricted vehicle access that is currently in place, the orange shows the sidewalk closure, and the pedestrian detour is shown using black arrows. What to Expect

Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services. People in the area can expect congestion, reduced speed, and overnight turn restrictions on W. Broadway. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. Residents will also experience elevated noise during the work. Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, conducting the noisiest construction activities during the day and minimizing the use of back-up beepers. Laurel St. remains accessible to Emergency Vehicles only.
