





# Traffic patterns are changing around Broadway-City Hall Station as major construction begins; Night Work

July 22, 2021

UPDATE: The notification dated July 9, 2021, has been updated with current scheduling details.

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building a traffic deck between Cambie and Alberta streets. While we build the traffic deck here, and at the future site of the Mount Pleasant station, traffic patterns will shift to a temporary three-lane configurations from Yukon to Alberta streets and from Main to Quebec streets. Once completed, the traffic deck at each station area maintains an at-grade, safe and consistent four-lane traffic configuration while station construction continues below. Residents and businesses may experience some noise and vibration as the drilling of structural supports begin for the traffic deck. People travelling in the area should expect congestion, temporary road closures, and reduced street parking, speed limits and travel lanes. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. Check out our Project video for more details on how we are building the traffic deck. The map below illustrates the traffic deck locations at the future Mount Pleasant and Broadway-City Hall Stations.

Please note, this information is current at the time of sending, however due to unforeseen circumstances, schedules are subject to change. BSPC will update this notification as specific dates and times for water shutdowns are confirmed.















# What to Expect



## **Timing**

- Traffic pattern changes will be implemented in three stages in consecutive order along Broadway.
  - June 21: Between Alberta and Yukon streets (complete);
  - July 11: Between Yukon to Cambie streets (complete).
  - As early as August 14: Between Cambie to Ash streets.
- Drilling continues on the south side of W. Broadway near Yukon Street. Remaining duration: less than 2 weeks.
- As early the first week of August, drilling continues on the southside of W.
  Broadway across the intersection at Yukon Street. Duration: 2 weeks.
- December 2021: Target date for the completion of the traffic deck.



#### Hours of Work\*

- Monday to Saturday
  - o Day: 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
  - Night work related to drilling structural supports: 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- \* Portions of site preparation and traffic deck installation may be done at night to minimize traffic disruptions.
- \* When possible, crews will perform the noisiest construction activities during the day to minimize overnight noise.
- \* Work will primarily be completed Monday to Saturday but may on occasion occur Sunday.



### Traffic

- Traffic on Broadway will be reduced to three lanes from Alberta to Yukon streets during this work (2 eastbound and 1 westbound).
- The intersection on the south side of W. Broadway at Yukon Street will be closed to vehicle traffic, but remains open to cyclists and pedestrians, while drilling progresses across the intersection.
- Flaggers and signs will assist pedestrians and cyclists navigate.



## Impacts/Interruptions

- Parking removal along Broadway
  - Between Cambie and Ash streets as early as August 9
- Curb lanes will be dedicated for emergency vehicles and buses.
- Transit users can check the <u>Trip Planner</u> as some stop locations have changed.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
- Sidewalks segments may be closed, and pedestrians detoured around work zones.
