





Update: Monitoring ground conditions near future station locations— Occasional Night Work

August 6, 2021

Following geotechnical investigations across the alignment of the future Millennium Line extension, the Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is returning to key locations in your neighbourhood to install instrumentation that monitors ground conditions.

Installing the monitoring equipment may result in temporary lane and sidewalk closures. Vehicle traffic will be diverted around the work and pedestrian access to residences, businesses, and services will be maintained. People in the area can expect some intermittent noise during installation activities and we anticipate crews will be at each site for at least half a day or longer in some areas. For activities that require night work, BSPC will directly contact businesses and residents affected in advance.

Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and follow instructions from traffic control personnel and all traffic signs. People travelling along Broadway and within two blocks of future station locations can expect temporary lane shifts within but not limited to the following areas:

- Great Northern Way between Thornton and Carolina streets
- Brunswick St. between E. 2nd and W. Broadway
- E. Broadway between Scotia and Quebec streets
- E. 8th Ave. between Brunswick and Scotia streets
- W. Broadway between Manitoba and Ash streets
- W. Broadway between Heather and Oak streets
- W. Broadway between Birch and Fir streets
- W. Broadway between Pine and Yew streets

What to Expect



Timing

Late July and through the fall



Hours of Work*

Monday to Saturday

- Day: 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Occasional night work may be required at some locations: 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- * Work will primarily be completed during the day, Monday to Saturday but may occasionally occur on Sunday.



Traffic

- Traffic in each direction will be maintained on Broadway during peak hours.
- One lane in each direction will be maintained on side- streets.
- Flaggers and traffic signs will assist pedestrians and cyclists to navigate the area.



Impacts/Interruptions

- Access to roads, properties, and businesses will be maintained.
- Temporary lane shifts while work is being performed
- Pedestrians may be temporarily detoured around work zones. Watch for signage.
- Some night work may be completed noise is expected to be similar to passing traffic.
- Transit users can check the <u>Trip Planner</u> as some stop locations may have changed.

We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood and on your property. Thank you in advance for your patience.
