





# Elevated Guideway construction starts on December 13


The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building the elevated guideway that connects VCC-Clark Station to the Great Northern Way-Emily Carr Station. On December 13, construction of the elevated guideway will start. This work involves drilling piles, the construction of 21 columns that support the guideway, and finishing with the installation of horizontal supports and slabs. Work is expected to be completed by end of 2022.

Residents and businesses in the area may experience some noise and vibration during construction activities, traffic congestion, possible temporary road closures and reduced street parking, speed limits, and travel lanes. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. ## What to Expect



#### **Timing**

December 13, 2021 until the end
of 2022



#### Hours of Work\*

- Monday to Friday, 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- Occasional nightwork may be required.



### Traffic

- Earl Finning Way is reduced to a single lane, eastbound only.
- No parking:
  - From the end of November to April 2023: Along the north side of Great Northern Way from 565 Great Northern Way west to Thornton St.
  - For about 2-months beginning early December: Along Earl Finning Way, Foley, and Fraser streets.
  - For about 4-weeks along Carolina Street for utility work starting in mid-December.
  - Drivers are encouraged to use existing parkades.



## Impacts/Interruptions

- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
- People travelling or living in the area may notice an increase in construction vehicles.
- Expect elevated noise during the excavation process.
