






Traffic deck installation starts in Broadway-City Hall in February

February 2, 2022

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building an at-grade, safe and consistent four-lane traffic deck. Installation of the traffic deck starts on the north side of W. Broadway, at Alberta Street moving towards Cambie Street. This involves placing support beams and traffic deck panels at night and then bolting the panels in place during the day. Once work on the north side is complete, excavation and installation will continue on the south side of W. Broadway. The traffic deck at Broadway-City Hall is expected to be completed in May 2022.

Residents and businesses will experience noise and vibration during the installation of the traffic deck. People in the area should expect temporary lane closures, reduced street parking, and reduced speed limits. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. What to Expect



Timing

February to May 2022



Hours of Work

- Monday to Saturday
 - Day: 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.
 - O Night work: 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.
 - May include occasional work on Sunday.



Traffic

- Traffic on W. Broadway between Alberta and Cambie streets will, at times, be reduced to single, alternating lanes, 12 a.m. to 5 a.m.
- Overnight there will be lane closures of up to 10 minutes for crane movements from 12 a.m. to 5 a.m.
- During peak hours (6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 8 p.m.), three lanes will be maintained on W. Broadway between Alberta and Cambie streets.
- Between 10 a.m. 3 p.m. two lanes will be maintained (one east and one west) between Alberta and Cambie streets.
- Turn restrictions in effect along W.
 Broadway at the intersections with Cambie, Yukon, and Alberta streets.
- Flaggers and signs will assist pedestrians and cyclists navigate.



Impacts/Interruptions

- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
- Pedestrians will be detoured around work zones as required.
- <u>Visit</u> the parking alternatives map for options.
- Transit users can check the <u>Trip</u>
 <u>Planner</u> as some stop locations have changed.

We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood and on your property. Thank you in advance for your patience.
