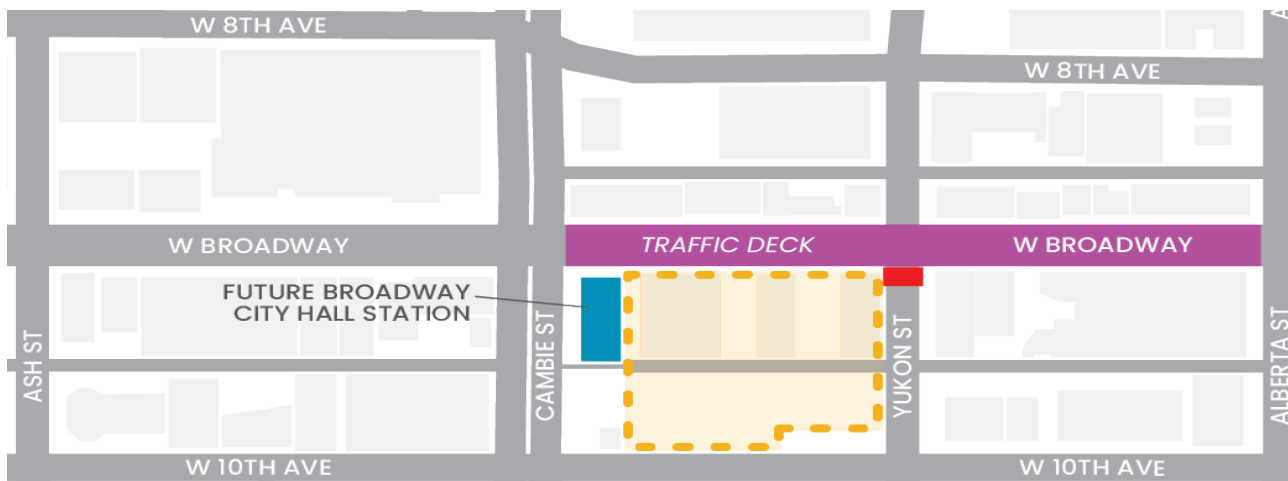


Night Work to install the final panels of the traffic deck in Broadway-City Hall starts May 24

May 20, 2022

Note: The updated notice from [February 2](#) included this work and we now have current night activities to share.

Night work to install the remaining sections of the Broadway-City Hall traffic deck begins on May 24 along W. Broadway from Alberta Street towards Cambie Street. Although most of the work continues during the day, nightwork is required for some activities. We expect the traffic deck will be completed in June. Want to learn more? What to Expect

Three lanes of traffic will be maintained during all peak hours, seven days a week in Broadway-City Hall. Between 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. traffic in this area will be reduced to two lanes, one east and one west. This will be in place until the traffic deck is completed. Once the traffic deck is completed, traffic will return to a four-lane configuration all day.

Residents and businesses will experience elevated noise and vibration. Pedestrians will be detoured around work zones as required. Please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. Flaggers and signs will assist pedestrians and cyclists to navigate.
