

Update: Geotechnical investigations on W. Broadway at Heather and Burrard streets continuing through November

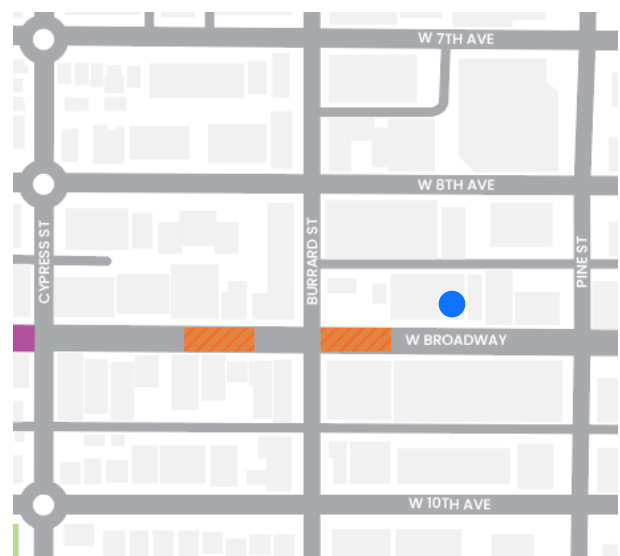
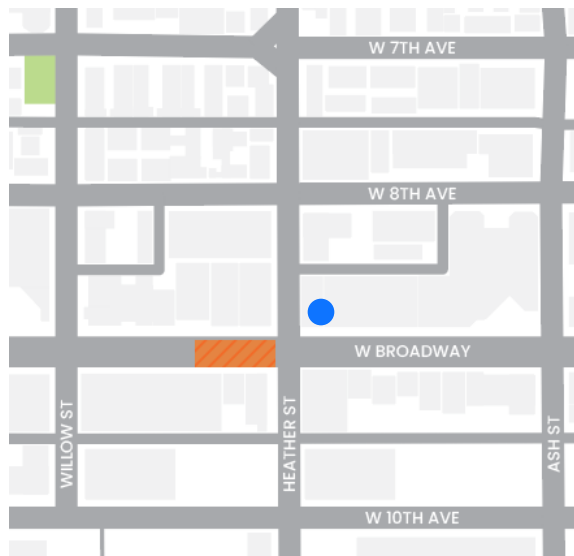

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) will be conducting geotechnical investigations in your neighbourhood to collect information that will inform planning for tunnel construction. Work will take place on November 22 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on W. Broadway at Heather Street and at Burrard Street on November 21. Additional dates in late November may be required. The work areas are shown in orange in the maps below. Work activities will include removal of asphalt, excavation, placing of road plates, installation of sensor equipment, and repaving the areas. The #99 B-Line eastbound bus stop at Heather Street will move from the west side to the east side of Heather Street during this work. Bus stops are shown below with a blue dot.

What to Expect

Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services. People in the area can expect elevated noise levels, temporary vehicle lane closures, some traffic congestion, reduced speeds, and to be detoured around the work as required. Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs. We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood. Thank you in advance for your patience.
