



# Night work at Broadway-City Hall to complete connections to Canada Line

# December 15, 2023

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building the future Broadway-City Hall Station. Crews are working along Cambie Street from W. Broadway to W. 10th Avenue to construct the future passenger connections between the Millennium Line extension and the existing Canada Line Station. This work will continue through Spring 2024 with work on the station continuing through 2024.

### Timing

- Regular night work takes place 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. with tunnelling work continuing 24/7.
- Typical hours of work are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays or holidays between the hours of 9 a.m. and 8 p.m.

#### What to expect

- Some elevated noise related to specific construction activities.
- Night work to excavate and construct the tunnelled passenger connections between the Millennium Line extension and the existing Canada Line Station.
- Starting early January, there will be open excavation at night on the Cambie Street sidewalk adjacent to the Canada Line Station. Pedestrian access will be maintained during the day with detours at night.
- Bus Stop #61027 will be relocated early in January to the southside of W. 10th Avenue.
- Lighting focused on work area to ensure crew safety.
- There will be intermittent night work to relocate equipment using mobile cranes.
- There may be intermittent nighttime deliveries of equipment and material.
- Intermittent temporary traffic lane restrictions during off-peak hours, changes to street parking and speed limits.

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, conducting the noisiest work during the day and shoulder hours, directing lights away from residential buildings, managing trucking to reduce the need for backing up, installing white noise back-up signals on equipment and monitoring noisy activities so that measures can be adapted as needed. Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.
