

Construction continues to build the South Granville Station

January 10, 2024

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation (BSPC) is in your neighbourhood building the future South Granville Station. With the arrival of both tunnel boring machines (TBMs), crews will continue working on the construction of the underground station. Tunnel boring activities at this site will continue as the TBMs advance towards the future Arbutus Station. Ongoing site activities include rebar installation, crane movement, delivery of materials and equipment, utilities maintenance, road and sidewalk repairs as required, and regular concrete pours, which will continue through 2024. Timing

- Regular work hours are from Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sunday and holidays.
- Night work hours are from 10 p.m. to 12 a.m. and will continue through spring 2024.
- We will continue to keep you informed of work in advance to help you plan accordingly.

What to expect

- Elevated noise related activities that include but are not limited to deliveries, concrete activities, rebar installation, road repairs, utility activities and crane movement of materials into the station area.
- Nighttime lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.
- Tunnel boring activities, including conveyor belt movement, continue 24/7.
- Possible temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to, conducting the noisiest construction activities during the day, while at night utilizing quieter models of equipment, including hand tools, white-noise backup signals, and directing all lights away from residential buildings. Please plan extra travel time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

- This phase will continue through 2024.



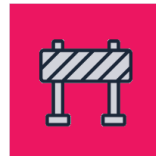
Hours of Work

- Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.
- There may be occasional work on Sundays or holidays.
- Intermittent night work from 10 p.m. to 12 a.m.
- Tunnel boring activities, including conveyor belt movement, continue 24/7.
- Please note the Project also has the ability to work overnight when required.



Traffic

- There may be temporary traffic restrictions, sidewalk modifications, pedestrian detours, and lower speed limits.
- Regular temporary lane closures on W. Broadway on weekdays between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., overnight or on weekends to support construction activities.
- Temporary lane closures on W. Broadway, Hemlock Street and West 8th Avenue may be implemented to support concrete pour activities.



Impacts/Interruptions

- Elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, deliveries, tunnel boring activities, conveyor belt movement and concrete pour activities.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night and concrete pour activities.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.
