Rail track welding starting at elevated guideway in Spring 2025 – includes intermittent night work

April 1, 2025

Work to install SkyTrain tracks at the elevated guideway is expanding this spring. Last year, crews began installing the track switches on the elevated guideway, which will allow trains to switch tracks and change directions as needed. Now, crews will begin welding pieces of rail together at the elevated guideway site and then transporting them into the tunnels and onto the elevated guideway for installation. To learn more about how rail is installed, view our [infographic](#). Meanwhile, work to install the crew walkway is also beginning on top of the elevated guideway.

To complete this work efficiently, we will continue primarily working during the day, with occasional overnight work. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses informed as we advance this major transit infrastructure project in your community.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials.

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Construction Activities

- Delivering materials, including trucking and crane activities.
- Welding rail segments together and transporting them for installation.
- Installing track on the elevated guideway and inside tunnels.
- Installation of the metal crew walkway on top of the elevated guideway.



Traffic

Closures:

- Earl Finning Way between Fraser and Foley streets.
- Foley Street north of parking access lane.
- Fraser Street north side closed to E. 1st Avenue and Earl Finning Way.

No parking:

- Along the north side of Great Northern Way, from 565 Great Northern Way west to Thornton Street.
- Along Earl Finning Way, Foley, and Fraser streets.
- Drivers are encouraged to use existing parkades.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rail welding, track installation, crane movement, and deliveries.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.



Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- Barriers to cover welding flash.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
