





Spring 2025 update on Broadway-City Hall Station construction – includes intermittent night work

April 1, 2025

The concrete roof section under W. Broadway between Yukon and Alberta streets has been completed, while construction of the future Broadway-City Hall Station west of Yukon Street progresses upwards, closer to the traffic deck and street level. Throughout spring 2025, work will focus on constructing the concourse-level walls, columns, and roof of the underground station. Work on Cambie Street between W. Broadway and 10th Avenue will continue to construct the connections to the Canada Line Station. Work is also happening in the tunnels to prepare for track installation. To complete this work efficiently, we will continue working primarily during the day and intermittently overnight. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses updated on our progress as we advance this major transit infrastructure project in your community.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- As work areas become enclosed, ventilation fan activity has increased to comply with WorkSafeBC requirements. Fans will be active during all hours of work to ensure the safety of crews.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials and concrete pours.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Construction Activities

- Pouring concrete.
- Delivering materials, including trucking and crane activities.
- Welding, waterproofing and rebar installation.
- Constructing the connections to the existing Canada Line Station under Cambie Street.
- Installing tracks inside the tunnels.
- Station construction is expected to continue through 2026.



Traffic

Regular temporary lane closures on W.
Broadway and Cambie Street between 10
a.m. and 3 p.m., overnight or on weekends
may be implemented to support
construction activities and deliveries.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, ventilation fans and deliveries.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.



Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Access will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
