





Concrete pours May 2 and 6 at the future Mount Pleasant Station

May 1, 2025

The Broadway Subway Project Corporation has scheduled concrete pours at the future Mount Pleasant Station on Friday, May 2 and Tuesday, May 6. Further details are below.



Construction Activities

Concrete pours will take place on May 2 and 6.

- May 2: Work hours are 6 a.m. to 3 p.m., with the first concrete truck arriving around 7 a.m. Approximately 6-7 concrete trucks are anticipated.
- May 6: Work hours are 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., with the first concrete truck arriving around 7 a.m. Approximately 60-65 concrete trucks are anticipated.



What to expect

- There will be two concrete pumps trucks operating on both days. One concrete pump truck will be set up inside the construction area on Quebec Street south of E. Broadway, and a second concrete pump truck will be set up inside the main construction site.
- Please note that concrete trucks are required to have their engines running at all times to keep their drums turning, and to use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- During large concrete pours, there may be times when additional holding areas for concrete trucks are temporarily required.



Traffic

Temporary traffic changes may be in place during the concrete pour as follows:

- Concrete trucks will arrive via E. 10th Avenue and Quebec Street, and will leave via the lane running between Quebec Street and E. 10th Avenue.
- The southbound curb lane on Main Street from Broadway to mid-block will be closed for concrete truck staging. During weekday pours, the southbound curb lane will reopen by 3 p.m.
