





Concrete pour November 7 at future Broadway-City Hall Station

November 5, 2025

Crews at Broadway-City Hall Station will carry out a concrete pour for the station's underground roof on November 7, completing the portion of the roof under Broadway. Broadway-City Hall is the fifth station to stamp a Canadian Maple Leaf on the underground roof, with a special edition Loonie embedded into the concrete. Approximately 610 m³ of concrete will be placed, which is enough to fill almost eight B-Line buses. Work on the connections to the Canada Line Station under Cambie Street continues.



Construction Activities

A concrete pour will take place on November 7:

- Work hours are from 6 a.m. to approximately 7 p.m. The first concrete truck will arrive around 7
- Low-noise work will continue into the evening to complete related activities.



What to expect

- Two concrete pump trucks will facilitate this pour, both of which will be set up at the west end of the construction site laydown area. Approximately 65 concrete trucks are expected.
- Please note that concrete trucks are required to have their engines running at all times to keep their drums turning, and to use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- During large concrete pours, there may be times when additional holding areas for concrete trucks are temporarily required.



Traffic

Temporary traffic changes may be in place during the concrete pours as follows:

Concrete trucks will enter and depart the construction site via Yukon Street between Broadway and W. 12th Avenue.
