Utility work at the future Oak-VGH Station

November 18, 2025

Work on the future Oak-VGH station is progressing and crews will begin reinstating permanent utilities in the area as soon as the end of November. Utility work is expected to be completed through spring 2026.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials, equipment movement and geotechnical work.
- Temporary changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and construction work.

What to expect at night

- If overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

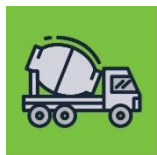

Construction Activities

- Deliveries of materials, including trucking and crane movement.
- Utility work taking place on W. Broadway between Oak and Laurel streets.
- Utility work taking place on Oak Street between 8th and 10th avenues.
- Hydrovac excavation, saw cutting, and backfilling.



Traffic

- Regular temporary lane closures on W. Broadway between Oak and Laurel streets between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., overnight or on weekends may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries.
- Oak Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction between W. Broadway and W. 10th Avenue.
- Left turn restrictions from W. Broadway to Oak Street.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to saw cutting hydrovac, excavation and backfilling.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials.



Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Businesses wayfinding signage will be installed as necessary.
