Broadway-City Hall Station Construction Update – Winter 2026

January 14, 2026

In the fall, the final section of the station roof below W. Broadway was poured, marking a milestone for Broadway-City Hall Station. A maple leaf and a special-edition Loonie — featuring pioneering Canadian aeronautical engineer Elsie MacGill — were embedded into the concrete as a lasting tribute.

Over the next three months, crews will focus on waterproofing, concrete pours, and rebar work to construct the station, and continue backfilling above the completed roof between Alberta and Yukon streets. Inside the station, masonry work, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing installations will progress, while work to extend the Canada Line platform continues. Excavation and construction of the vent shaft and emergency exit is expected to start, along with permanent utility works on Broadway and Yukon Street north and south of W. Broadway.

To complete this work efficiently, we will continue working primarily during the day and intermittently overnight. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses informed as this important transit project moves forward in your neighbourhood.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials and construction activities.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Construction Activities

- Pouring concrete.
- Deliveries of materials and equipment, including trucking and crane activities.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Welding, waterproofing, rebar installation, road work and masonry ongoing.
- Utility work on Yukon Street north and south of W. Broadway and west of Alberta Street.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



Traffic

- Regular temporary lane closures on W. Broadway and Cambie Street between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., overnight or on weekends may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, road repairs, hydro vac, deliveries, and backfilling.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.



Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
