## Mount Pleasant Station Construction Update – Winter 2026

January 16, 2026

Work to complete Mount Pleasant Station continues as traffic deck removal and road reconstruction gets underway this winter. Inside the station, crews are busy installing the equipment that will power and control the SkyTrain, including mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems, and completing masonry work throughout each level. Work on the vent shafts and emergency exit on Quebec Street also continues.

Outside of the station, backfilling activities to fill the space between the completed station roof and the roadway is ongoing. Beginning January 26, E. Broadway will be closed to vehicle traffic between Main and Quebec streets for approximately four months, while crews complete traffic deck removal, utility relocation and road reconstruction work in that block. During this time, transit vehicles and local traffic will detour around the temporary one-block closure via E 8th Avenue. Sidewalks will remain open on E. Broadway and access to businesses, services and residences will be maintained at all times.

### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the removal of the traffic decks.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate construction activities.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

## Further details



### Construction Activities

- Dismantling and removing traffic deck panels and supporting girders.
- Utility work on E. Broadway between Main and Quebec streets.
- Pouring concrete.
- Delivering materials using trucks and cranes.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Welding, waterproofing, roadwork, masonry and installing rebar.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



### Traffic

- E. Broadway between Main and Quebec Streets will be closed to all vehicles starting January 26 for about four months.
- A detour for transit vehicles and local traffic is in effect via Quebec Street and 8th Avenue.
- For more information about parking on Broadway, check our parking and access maps page.
- Temporary lane or sidewalk closures may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries:
  - Main Street southbound curb lane and/or west sidewalk south of E. Broadway.



### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, traffic deck removal, rebar installation, crane movement, deliveries, road repairs, hydro vac and backfilling.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate traffic deck removal or deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.



### Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
