## New construction activities starting this spring at Arbutus Station

March 31, 2026

This spring, construction at the future Arbutus Station is entering a new phase, with crews beginning to reinstate permanent utilities and remove the traffic deck. One lane in each direction will be maintained on W. Broadway as crews rebuild the roadway above the completed station roof. In total, crews will remove 139 traffic deck panels and 28 girders, together weighing nearly 2,000 tonnes.

Work to install permanent utilities will begin in spring between Arbutus and Cypress streets. This includes the Capilano Main network, which delivers nearly one billion litres of drinking water every day. Meanwhile, crews will continue to backfill above the station, with work moving west towards Arbutus Street. Inside the station, masonry works, mechanical and electrical installation continues.

To complete this work efficiently, crews will continue working primarily during the day and intermittently overnight. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses informed as this important transit project moves forward in your neighbourhood. ### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular hours of work are from Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work that starts earlier or work on Sunday and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities described below
- Ventilation fans are required to comply with WorkSafeBC requirements and will be active during all hours of work to ensure the safety of crews.
- Temporary traffic changes related to materials delivery, utilities reinstatement and traffic deck removal.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

### Construction Activities

- Material delivery, welding, waterproofing, excavation, saw cutting and hydro vac.
- Crane movements to dismantle and remove traffic deck panels and supporting girders.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Reinstating utilities between and along Arbutus and Cypress streets.
- Activities to support work inside the tunnels.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



### Traffic

- One lane in each direction on W. Broadway between Arbutus and Burrard Street is maintained.
- Traffic impacts on Arbutus Street related to utility work. More information to be provided in advance of the work.
- Maple Street is closed to vehicles and cyclists between W. Broadway and the laneway towards 8th Avenue.
- W. 8th Avenue is one way only eastbound between Maple and Burrard streets.
- We recommend cyclists follow Arbutus Greenway detour signage.

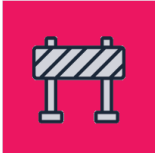

### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, backfilling, rebar installation, crane movement, ventilation fans, road works, and deliveries.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.



### Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
