## Permanent utility work at Broadway-City Hall Station taking place in three areas

March 11, 2026

Work at the future Broadway-City Hall Station is progressing, and in the coming months crews will continue installing permanent storm and sanitary utilities in the area. This work will be completed in phases and is expected to continue through the spring. The first phase of work began on February 25 on Yukon Street north of Broadway and is expected to continue approximately through March. Work will continue in two more phases: Yukon Street south of Broadway, and Broadway west of Alberta Street. Work will move through these locations sequentially to help minimize overall impacts and maintain access for residents, businesses, and transit users. Utility work is anticipated to continue through spring. Any planned service interruptions, if required, will be communicated in advance.

### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some activities, such as tie-ins to existing utilities, or installing temporary bypasses, may require overnight work between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials, equipment movement, and geotechnical work.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian routes to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood. ## Further details



### Construction Activities

- Deliveries of materials, equipment staging, and trucking activities.
- Excavation, saw cutting, hydrovac, trenching, backfilling and resurfacing work.
- Installation of new storm and sanitary infrastructure, including manholes and underground piping.
- Periodic use of bypass pumps to maintain sewer service while crews complete connections.
- Utility work taking place on Yukon Street between W. 8th and W. 10th avenues, and on Broadway, west of Alberta Street.



### Traffic

- Traffic will not be permitted northbound on Yukon Street between W. 8th Avenue and W. Broadway.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials, equipment movement, and utility work.
- Temporary changes to pedestrian routes to accommodate deliveries and construction work.
- Please watch for and obey traffic control personnel and all signs and plan extra travel time.



### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to excavation, saw cutting, hydrovac, trenching, backfilling and resurfacing work.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.



### Mitigations

- Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:
- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
  - White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
  - Directing lights away from residential buildings.
  - Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
  - Businesses wayfinding signage will be installed, as necessary.
