## Broadway-City Hall Station Construction Update – Spring 2026

April 8, 2026

The final section of underground station roof below Cambie Street has been completed as construction of Broadway-City Hall progresses upwards. Over the next three months, station construction will continue and crews will focus on waterproofing, concrete pours, and rebar installation. Inside the station, masonry, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing work will advance, along with construction of the connections to the existing Canada Line station. Backfilling above the completed roof on Broadway between Alberta and Cambie streets will continue, while backfilling above the newly completed roof on Cambie Street will begin this spring, followed by street restoration work on Cambie Street. Work on the emergency exit will also progress during this time. Micropiling to support construction of the ventilation shafts will begin this spring on W. Broadway between Yukon and Cambie streets.

Crews are now installing permanent utilities in and around the station, starting with Yukon Street between W. 8th and W. Broadway. Utility installations will also take place on Yukon Street south of W. Broadway and on W. Broadway west of Alberta Street later this spring.

To complete this work efficiently, we will continue working primarily during the day and intermittently overnight. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses informed as this important transit project moves forward in your neighbourhood.

### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials and construction activities.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

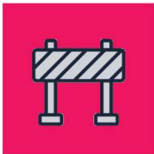
### Construction Activities

- Deliveries of concrete, materials, equipment, including trucking and crane activities.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Welding, waterproofing, rebar installation, masonry, saw cutting, excavation, concrete chipping, hydro vac, micropiling, and roadworks.
- Utility work on Yukon Street between W. 8th and W. 10th avenues, and Broadway west of Alberta Street.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



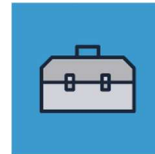
### Traffic

- Lane closures on W. Broadway between Cambie and Alberta streets to support utility work on Yukon Street through spring.
- Yukon Street will remain closed north of Broadway through April to support utility work. Access will be maintained via W. 8th Avenue for local traffic.



### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, ventilation fans, saw cutting, excavation, concrete chipping, hydro vac, micropiling, backfilling, roadworks, and deliveries.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.



### Mitigations

- Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:
- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
  - White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
  - Directing lights away from residential buildings.
  - Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
  - Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
