## Traffic deck removal work to begin at Broadway-City Hall this summer

May 6, 2026

Work to remove the traffic deck and rebuild the roadway will begin at Broadway-City Hall this summer. To complete this work efficiently, W. Broadway between Alberta and Cambie streets will be temporarily closed to vehicles for approximately six months with a detour in place via W. 8th Avenue. Pedestrian access to businesses, services, and residences will remain open throughout the work. With a detour in place, crews can complete this phase of work much more quickly than if traffic were maintained on W. Broadway, reducing the overall length of time that residents, commuters, and businesses are impacted by construction.

During the closure, crews will remove the girders and 133 road panels that make up the traffic deck, backfill above the station, install permanent utilities and rebuild the roadway to a final configuration of four lanes of traffic.

### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours for traffic deck removal are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There will be occasional nightwork.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes on W. 8th Avenue, Alberta Street, Cambie Street, and Ash Street.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

### Construction Activities

- Crane movements to dismantle and remove traffic deck panels and supporting girders.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Reinstating utilities along Yukon Street, between 8th and 10th avenues and on Broadway between Alberta and Yukon streets.
- Preparations to construct the detour route will begin this spring along 8th Avenue, Alberta Street, Cambie Street and Ash Street.
- Roadworks including concrete pours to construct the road and sidewalks.
- Station construction activities will continue alongside traffic deck removal.



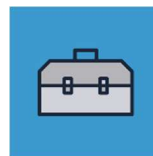
### Traffic

- W. Broadway will be closed to vehicles between Alberta and Cambie streets starting this summer.
- The detour start date will be communicated at least two weeks in advance.
- Vehicle traffic will be detoured via Alberta Street, W. 8th Avenue, and Ash Street back to Broadway.
- Transit priority measures will be in place during the detour. Transit vehicles will detour via Alberta Street, 8th Avenue and Cambie Street back to Broadway.
- The 99 B-Line will stop on Broadway between Ash and Cambie streets. Visit [TransLink.ca](https://www.translink.ca) for current rider information.



### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, crane work, backfilling, concrete pours, and utility work.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.



### Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- Dust mitigation measures will be implemented throughout the work.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
