Mount Pleasant Station Construction Update – Summer 2026

June 24, 2026

Over the last several months, crews have been busy restoring Broadway between Quebec and Main streets and all four vehicle lanes will be open as of June 25, with some intermittent lane closures still required to finalize sidewalks, the final lift of asphalt, and other finishing work. The installation of green infrastructure along the boulevard, as well as street furniture on the newly widened sidewalks will continue through the summer.

At the station, work is focused on the construction of the above-ground steel structure, with crews installing ceiling panels, painting rooms and building the elevator structures. Activities also include fitting out the mechanical, electrical, and plumbing infrastructure and systems that will power and operate the SkyTrain utility work, and the construction of the vent shafts and emergency exit along Quebec Street.

Crews are completing masonry work across all station levels. Over the summer, dynamic testing will move past the Mount Pleasant Station and head west, marking an important step toward commissioning.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials and construction activities.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate construction activity.

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

Construction Activities

- Roadworks such as street cleaning, line painting, concrete pours, concrete demolition, landscaping, paving and occasional hydro vac.
- Deliveries of materials, including trucking and crane activities.
- Utility work.
- Welding, waterproofing and rebar installation, other activities ongoing, where they are.



Traffic

- For more information about parking on Broadway, check our parking and access maps page.
- Temporary lane or sidewalk closures may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries:
 - Main Street southbound curb lane and/or west sidewalk south of E. Broadway



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, roadworks such as street cleaning, line painting, concrete pours, concrete demolition, landscaping and occasional hydro vac.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.



Mitigations

- Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:
- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
 - White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
 - Directing lights away from residential buildings.
 - Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
 - Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.
