



## Road restoration underway at Arbutus Station – includes night work

June 19, 2026

Traffic deck removal is underway at the future Arbutus Station. Crews are currently removing traffic deck panels and girders on Broadway between Maple and Cypress streets. To support this work, the crosswalk across W. Broadway at Maple Street is moving to the west side of the intersection on Friday, June 19. Crews will continue with backfilling and will begin utility reinstatement at the Cypress Street and Broadway intersection, as well as on W. 8th Avenue between Arbutus and Maple streets. The north side of W. Broadway will be restored first, allowing traffic to be maintained while work continues on the south side. W. Broadway will remain open to vehicles one lane in each direction. As construction activities change, we are also able to reinstate two-way traffic on W. 8th Avenue between Arbutus and Burrard streets beginning as early as June 20. At the same time, a new truck access to the site will be created via W. 8th Avenue.

To complete this work efficiently, crews will continue working primarily during the day, with intermittent overnight work as required. We remain committed to keeping residents and businesses informed as this important transit project moves forward in your neighbourhood. ### What to expect during daytime work

- Regular hours of work are from Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work that starts earlier or work on Sunday and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities as described below.
- Ventilation fans are required to comply with WorkSafeBC requirements and will be active during all hours of work to ensure the safety of crews.
- Temporary traffic changes related to materials delivery, utilities reinstatement and traffic deck removal.

### What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

## Further details



### Construction Activities

- Material delivery, welding, waterproofing, excavation, saw cutting and hydro vac.
- Crane movements to dismantle and remove traffic deck panels and supporting girders.
- Backfilling, including the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Reinstating utilities on Arbutus and Cypress streets between W. 8th Avenue and Broadway.
- Activities to support work inside the tunnels.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



### Traffic

- W. 8th Avenue will reopen to two-way traffic between Maple and Burrard streets beginning June 20.
- One lane in each direction on W. Broadway between Burrard and Yew streets will be maintained.
- Temporary lane closures may be implemented on Arbutus and Cypress streets and on W. 8th Avenue.
- Temporary turning restrictions at Cypress and Arbutus streets at W. Broadway to support construction activities.
- A new truck access to the site will be created via W. 8th Avenue.



### Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, backfilling, rebar installation, crane movement, ventilation fans, hydro vac, road works, and deliveries.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.



### Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
