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Oak-VGH Construction Update – Includes Night Work – Summer 2026

July 13, 2026

Summer construction is bringing major progress to the future Oak–VGH Station above and below Broadway. Crews have completed the removal of traffic deck panels on the south side of Broadway. Did you know each traffic deck panel weighs approximately 8,000 pounds about the weight of an adult orca whale?

Crews continue working on the station entrance which includes the elevator and escalator structure construction and the installation of the ceiling panels at the platform level. The neighbourhood can also expect continued utility work, increased trucking activity in the lane way between Laurel and Oak streets, and temporary traffic changes.

What to expect during daytime work

- Regular work hours are Monday to Saturday from 6 a.m. until 10 p.m. There may be occasional work on Sundays and holidays.
- Some elevated noise during specific activities.
- Temporary traffic changes related to the delivery of materials and concrete pours.
- Temporary lane closures and changes to pedestrian access to accommodate deliveries and trucking activity.

What to expect at night

- When overnight work is required, work hours can range from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- We expect there will be some night work to support utility work at the Oak and Broadway intersection in August. Additional details will be provided in advance.
- Overnight lighting focused on our sites to ensure crew safety during utility work.

We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed. See below for further information.

When travelling through construction zones, please plan extra time, watch for wayfinding information, and obey traffic control personnel and all signs.

We know that construction can be disruptive, and we are working hard to minimize impacts in your neighbourhood. 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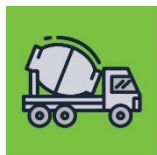


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Further details



Construction Activities

- Utility work on W. Broadway between Oak and Laurel streets.
- Delivering materials using trucks and cranes.
- Road restoration including backfilling, the delivery, movement, and compacting of gravel.
- Welding, waterproofing, roadwork, masonry and installing rebar.
- Structural steel installation.
- Station construction will continue through 2026.



Traffic

- W. Broadway is reduced to one lane in each direction during traffic deck removal and road reconstruction work.
- Regular temporary lane closures Oak and Laurel Streets may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries.
- Temporary sidewalk closures may be implemented to support construction activities and deliveries.



Impacts

- Some elevated noise related to activities that include, but are not limited to, rebar installation, crane movement, structural steel, ventilation fans and deliveries.
- Concrete trucks are required to keep their engines running to keep their drums turning and use traditional back-up alarms for crew safety.
- Trucking activity to accommodate deliveries of equipment and materials during the day or night.
- Access for all will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.



Mitigations

Mitigation measures include, but are not limited to:

- Noise barriers installed around some sources of noise.
- White noise back-up signals on equipment when possible.
- Directing lights away from residential buildings.
- Using quieter models of equipment at night, such as hand tools.
- Access for all abilities will be maintained to residences, businesses, and services.



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
