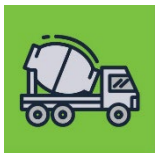


Oak-VGH Station – Scheduled Night Work and Traffic Deck Removal Activities

August 20, 2026

Crews are continuing construction of the future Oak-VGH Station, with work progressing inside and outside the station. On Sunday, August 23, crews will work overnight at the manhole in the middle of the Oak Street and W. Broadway intersection to commission the storm and sanitary lines. This work is scheduled overnight when sewer flows are lower and will include CCTV inspection.

Then on August 27, traffic on W. Broadway between Laurel and Oak streets will shift to the south side of the road, where traffic deck removal is complete. This will allow crews to remove the traffic deck on the north side. To prepare for the traffic switch, there will be an additional night of work scheduled for August 26 to complete line eradication and line painting. Traffic deck removal and road restoration work will continue through the end of this year. Further details are available below.



Construction Activities

- On August 23, utility inspection work will take place at the Oak Street and Broadway intersection from 6 p.m. until 1 a.m.
- On August 26, crews will be line painting and line eradicating overnight ahead of the traffic switch on Broadway from 7 p.m. until 5 a.m. the following morning.
- On August 27, traffic on Broadway will shift to the south side of the roadway to allow crews to remove the traffic deck on the north side. This work will continue through the fall.



What to expect

- Some elevated noise related to construction activities, including line eradication.
- Overnight lighting and equipment will be in the enclosed utility work area.
- We strive to minimize impacts of construction activities on our neighbours, and we are regularly monitoring and adapting mitigations as needed.
- Access to businesses, health services, and residences will be maintained.



Traffic

- Broadway will continue to be reduced to one lane between Willow and Spruce Streets.
- Turn restrictions at the Oak Street and Broadway intersection.
- On August 23, traffic personnel will be at the intersection to assist with traffic management during CCTV night work.
